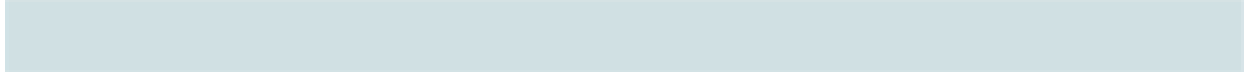


**D. Mein Freund das Pferd.** Ask Christine about her friendship with horses. In German, of course
